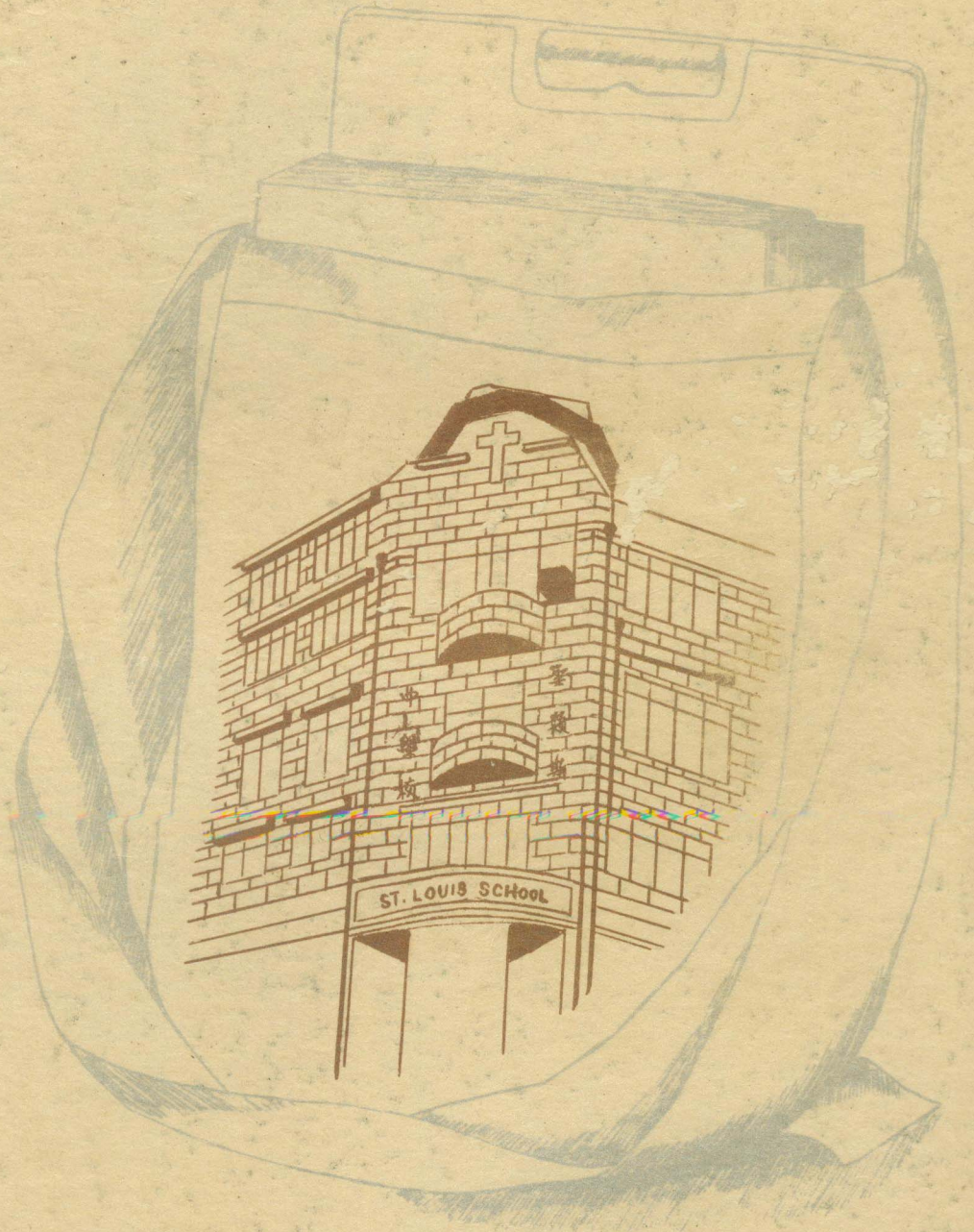

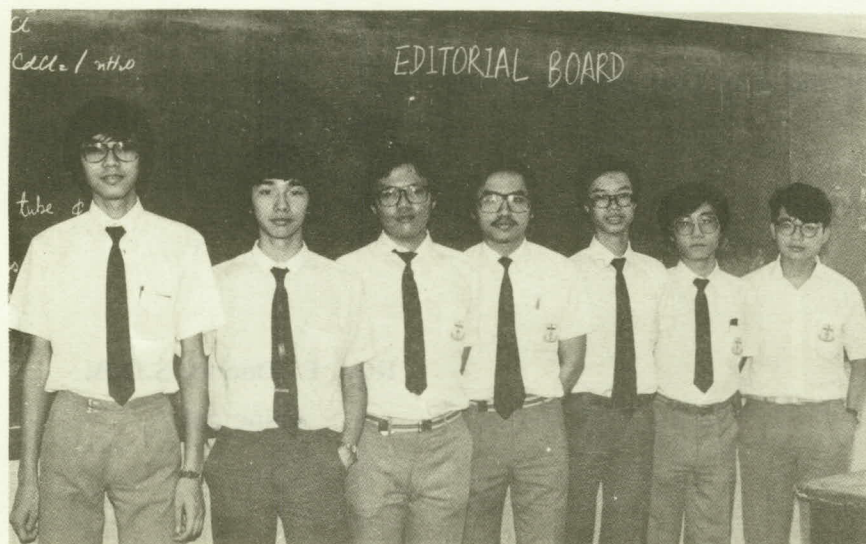
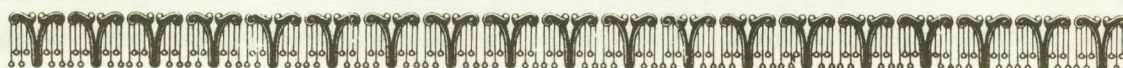


# FOREWORD


Yet, I dare say "Let us go forward!": every day better, every day more.

二、我們已向含有基督的麵餅許諾，希望藉着祂聖體的助佑，在世上發展友愛精神，因為我們原為一體，基督是這個個體的頭，我們却是肢體。故此，「亞孟」正代表了我們對天主一個「愛德的承諾」。

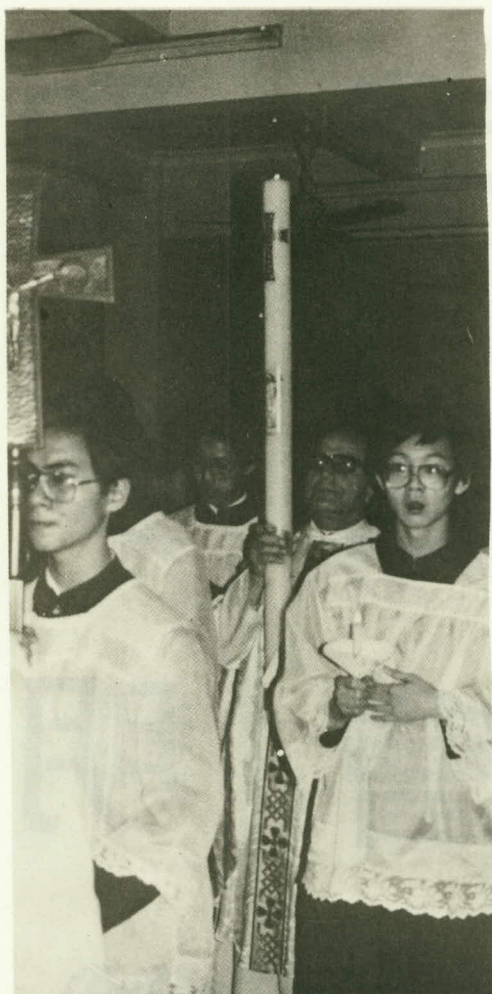
## 聖母軍

- 二、「上天之門支團」，由魯炳義院長領導。



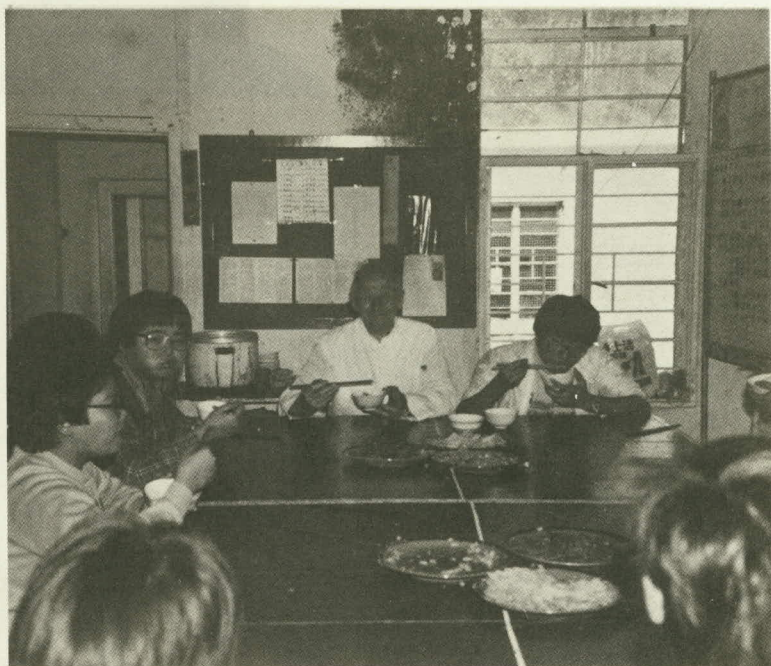


# 聖多明我善會

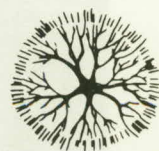
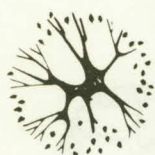


# 思高青年中心

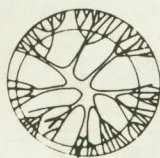

## ANNUAL REPORT

To start with, a gathering of members was held in General Science Room in October to enhance the comradeship and closer union between the members.

In December there came the publications of the Christmas Card and the first among the four issues in this scholastic year of the school newspaper, 'Aloysians'.

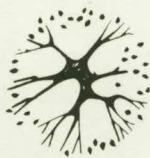

As in the past, a series of functions celebrating the Thanksgiving Day were launched by the Association to express we students' heartfelt gratitude to our fathers and teachers. The Thanksgiving Day Notice-board Design Competition was followed by our annual school concert, Thanksgiving Nite, which took place on 17th March, 1983 at Loke Yew Hall. Certainly, the 500 audience enjoyed a wonderful night with the various performances made by our fellow-students, old boys and the teachers. On the Thanksgiving Day the Association played an exciting and entertaining football match against the staff after mass for the newly introduced "Prefects' Association Cup".

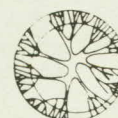
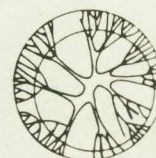
And now, a word from the sponsor.

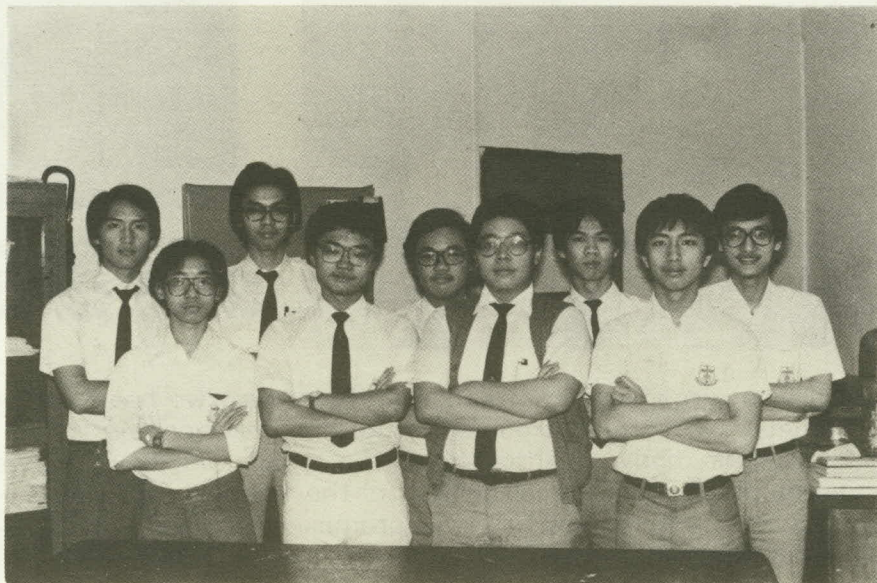
# Independent Clubs Association

Each department has a department head, and this year the three Department Heads are:

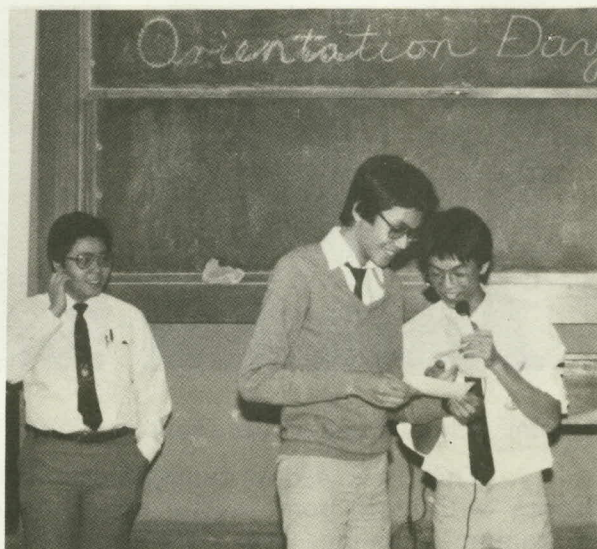

## Activities

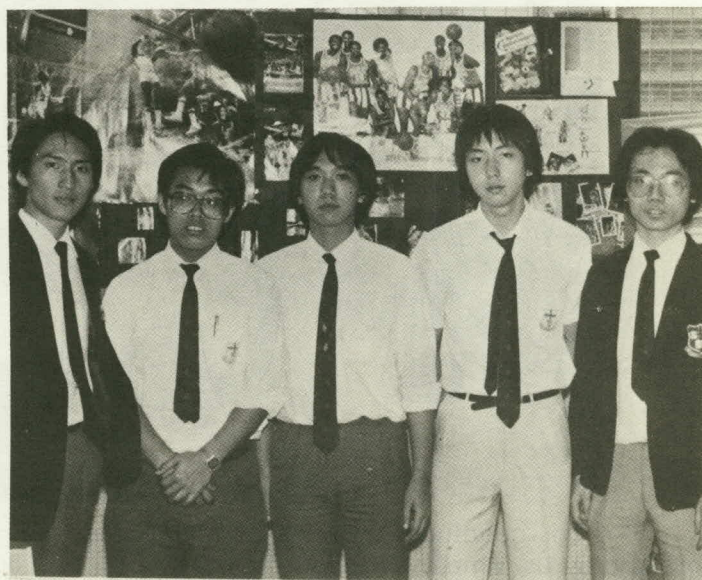
### 1. Orientation Day

During the first semester, we organised an Orientation Day for the Chairman and Vice-chairman of member clubs. During the function, games were played in order to increase mutual communication among the clubs.

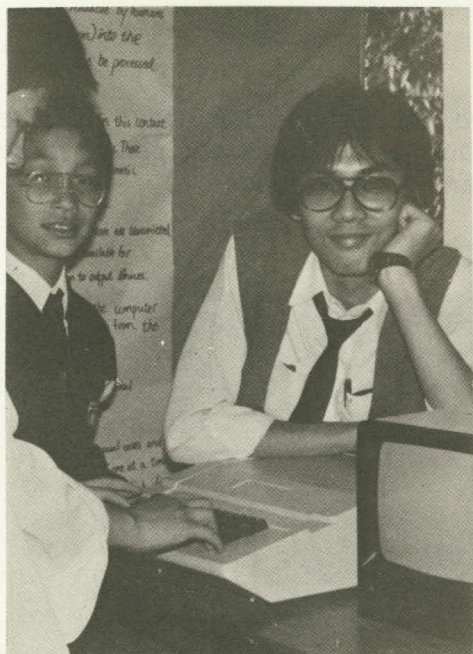


### 2. Exhibition for students

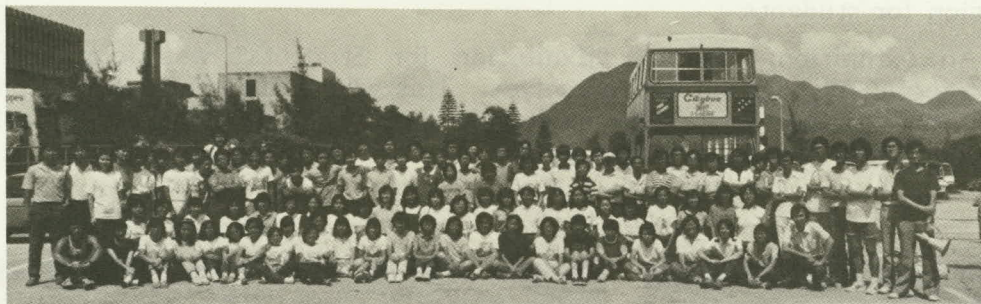






### 3. Joint School Leadership Training Camp 1983

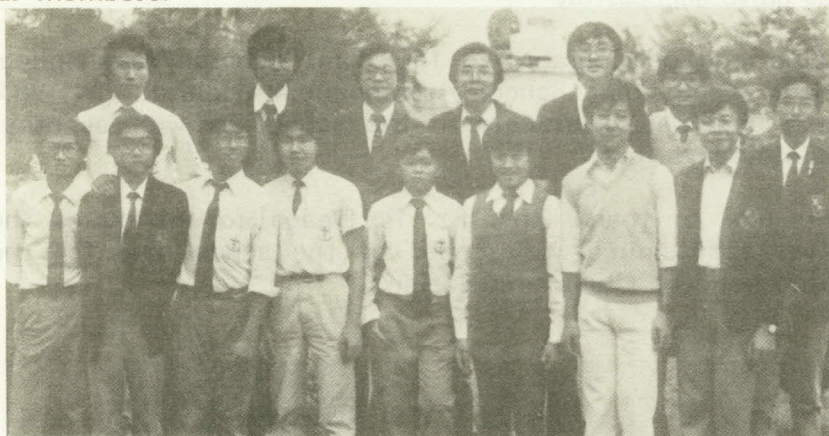


# OUTING CLUB

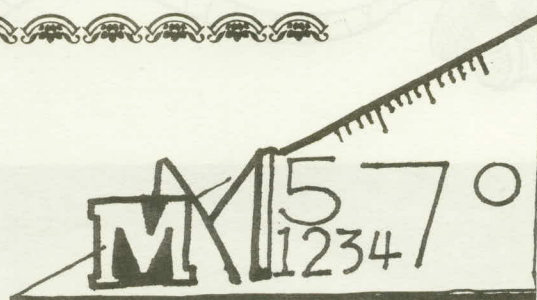
This was actually the fifth year of operation of our club. The aim of our club is to provide more chances for our members to increase their knowledge through taking part in outdoor activities.

In the coming year, we do hope for the full support of our fellow students.



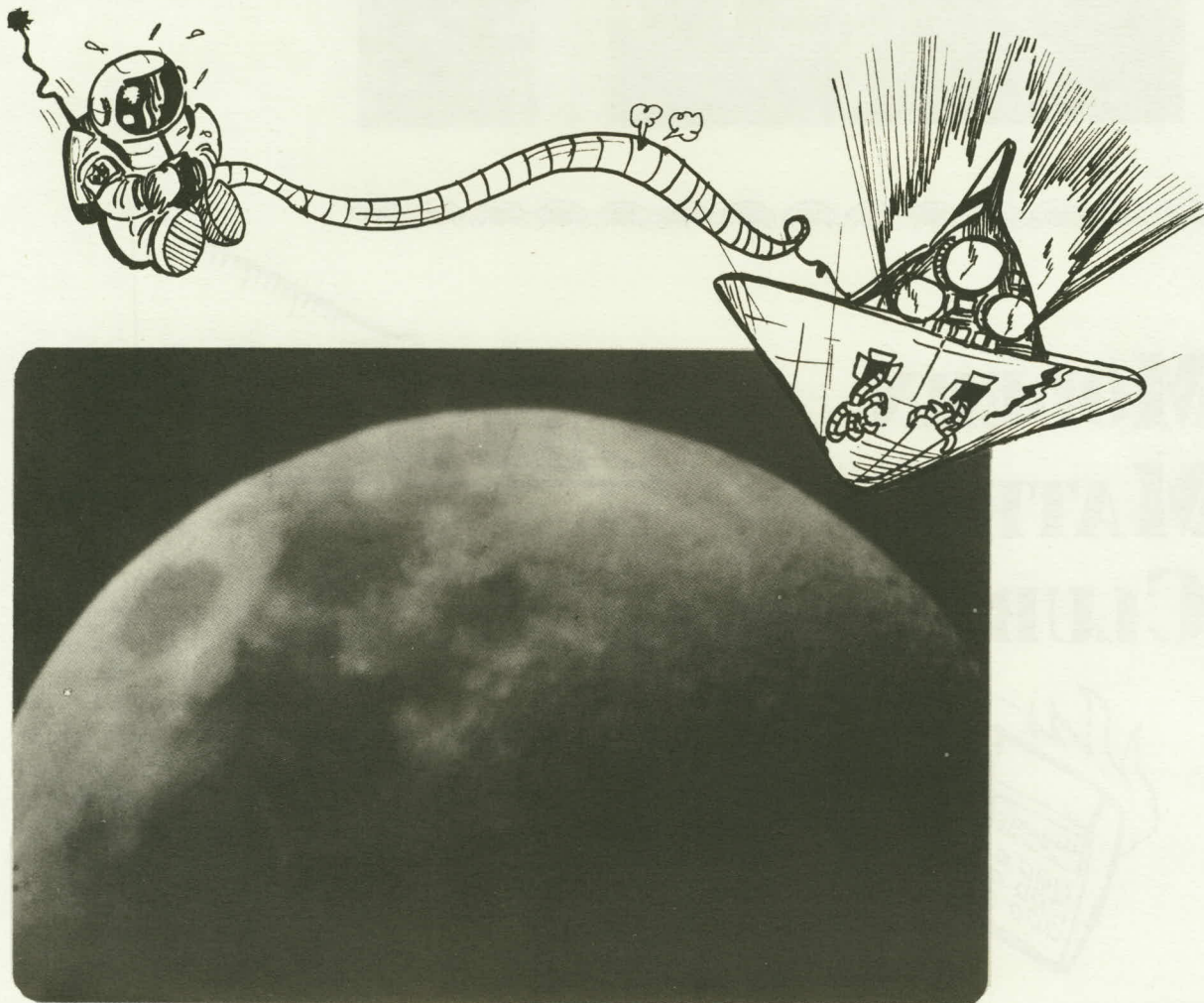
# ASTRONOMY CLUB

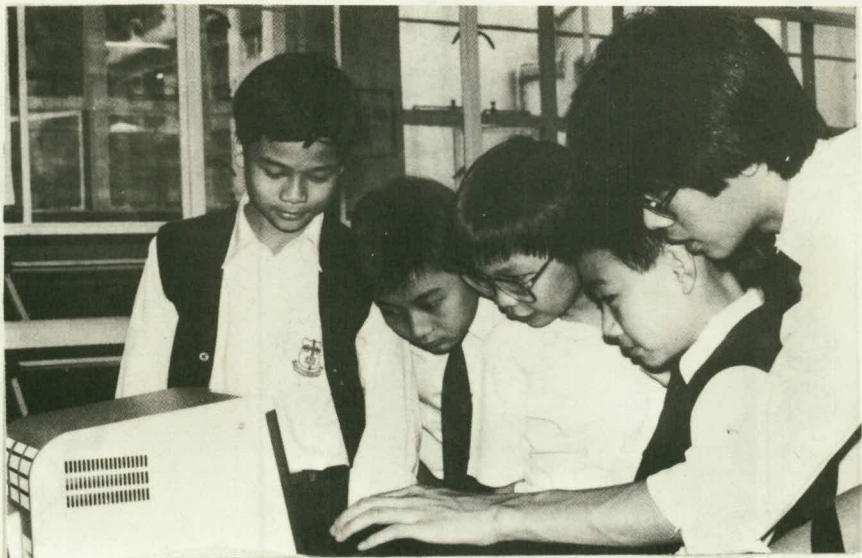
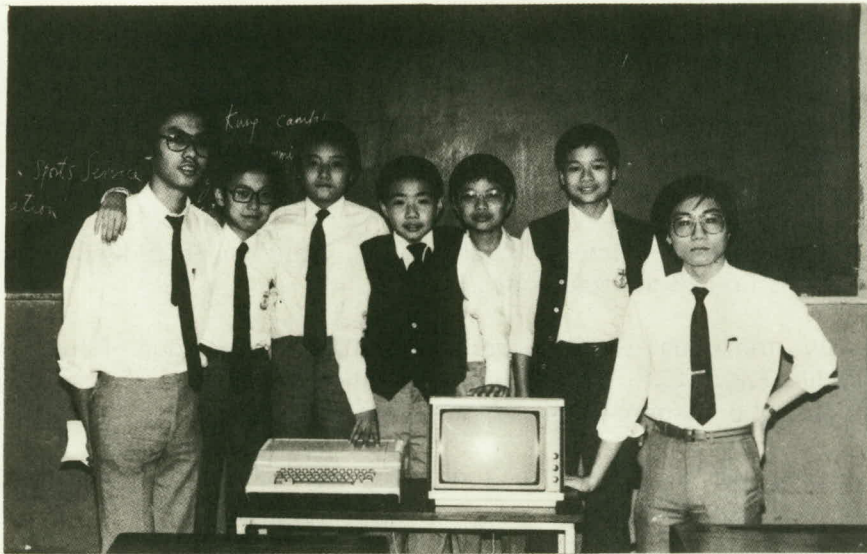


# COMPUTER SOCIETY

# Bridge Society

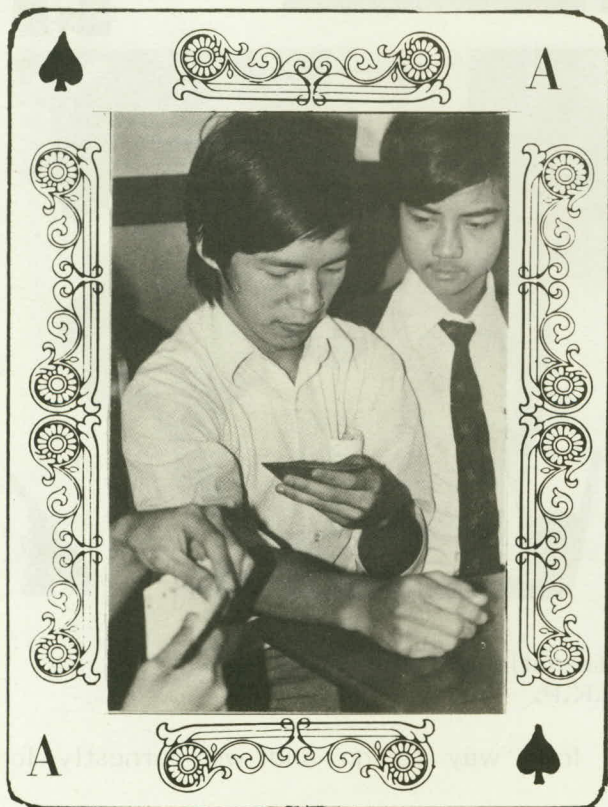

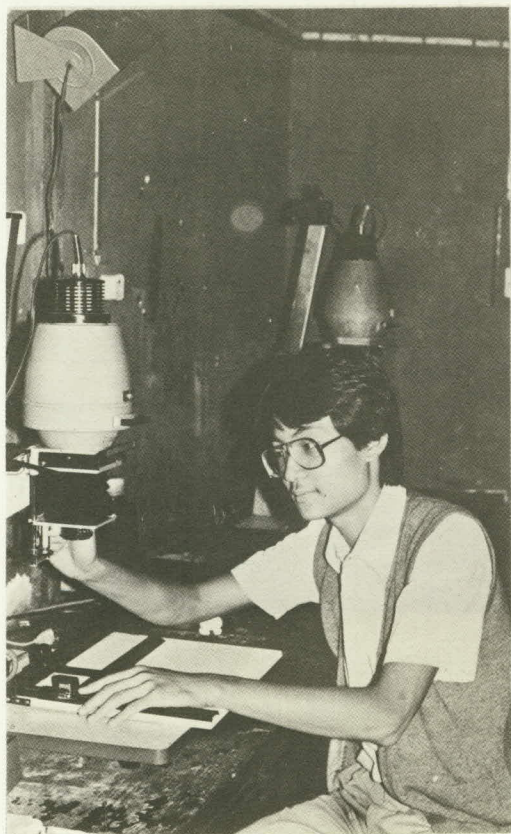
# PHOTOGRAPHIC CLUB

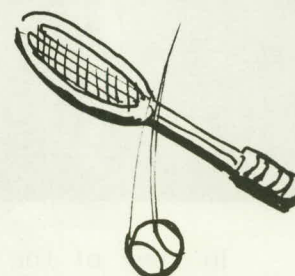

Finally, we want to express our warmest thanks to Mr. Law Yin Shun and Mr. Liu Kin Hon for their precious advice and encouragement.

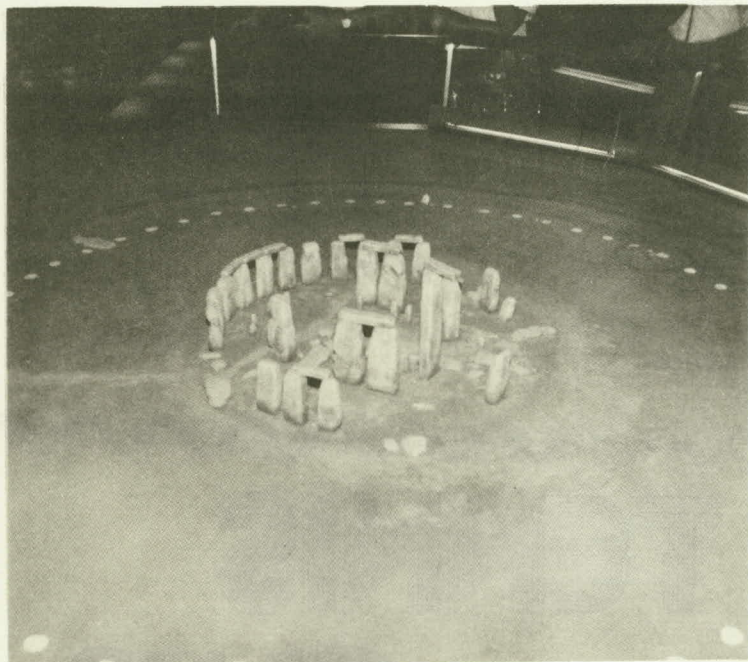
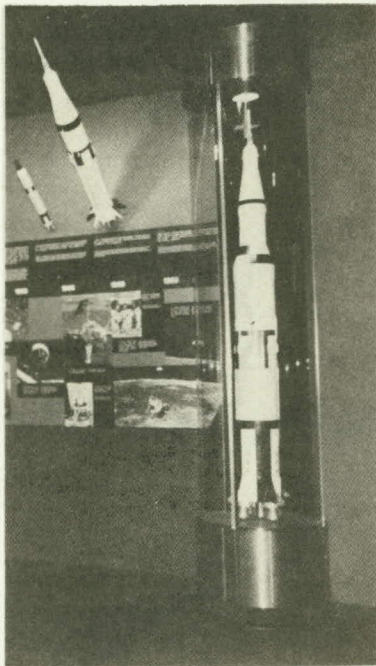


# SCIENCE SOCIETY

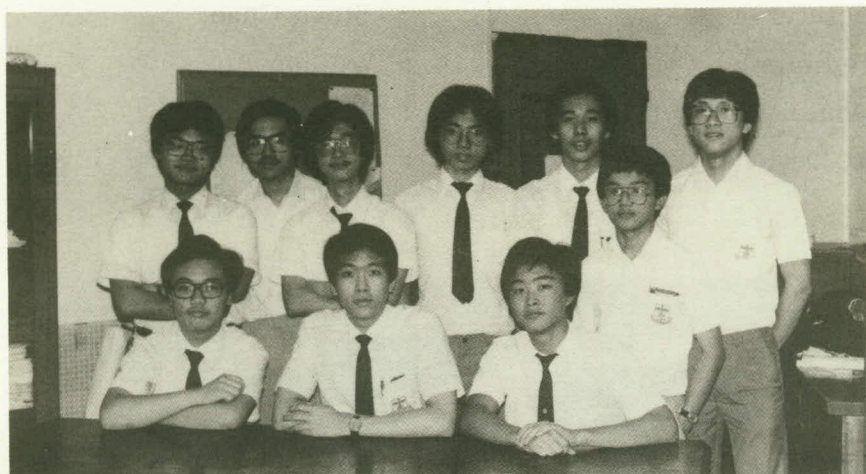

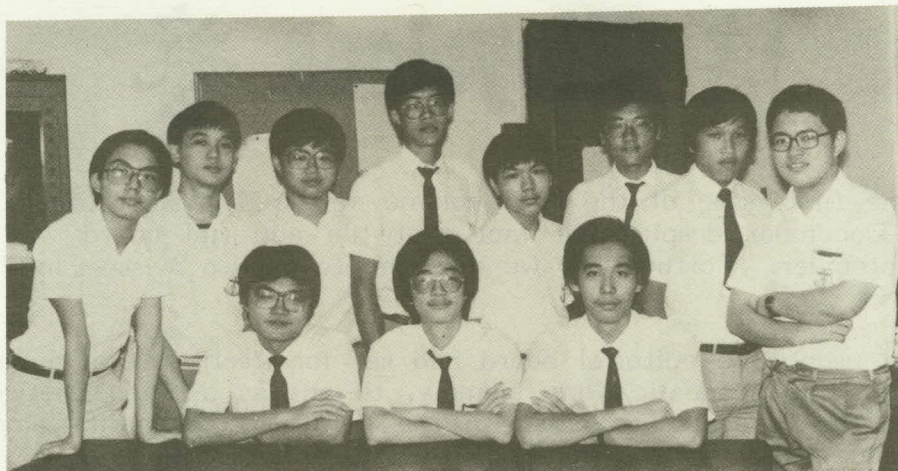

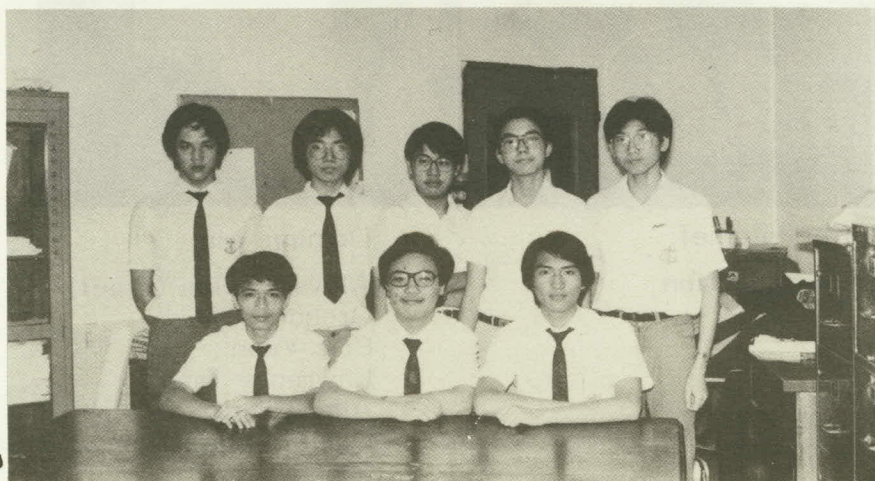

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# SAILING BOAT AND CANOE CLUB

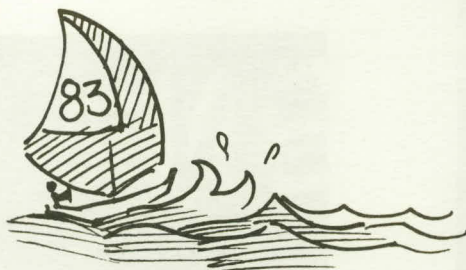
The Sailing Boat and Canoe Club was established in 1972 to promote the interest of the fellow members in sailing.

In October, together with the Music Association, the Orchestral Organization, the Chinese Traditional Music Society and St. Clare's Girls' School, we are going to hold a variety concert.

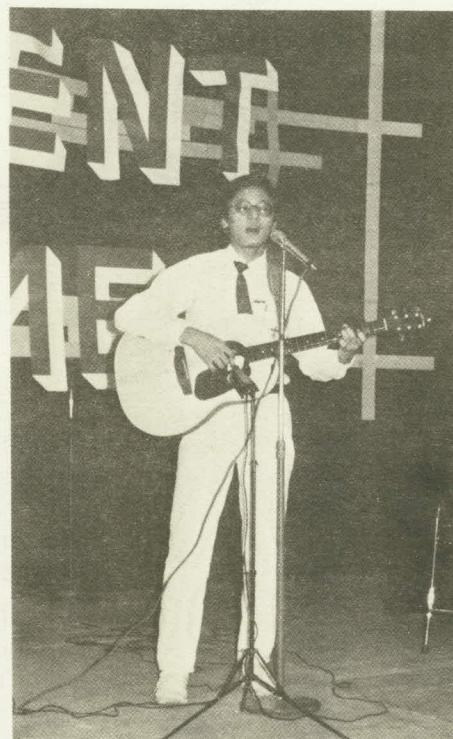
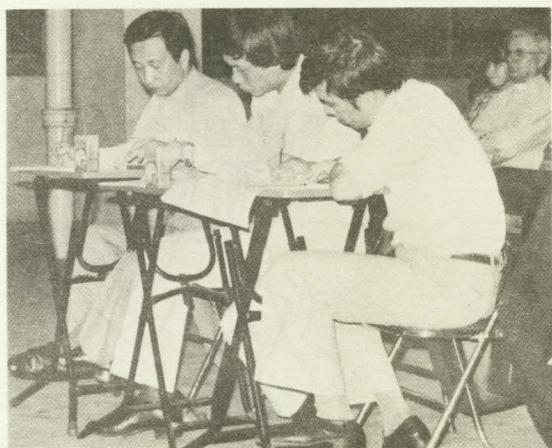

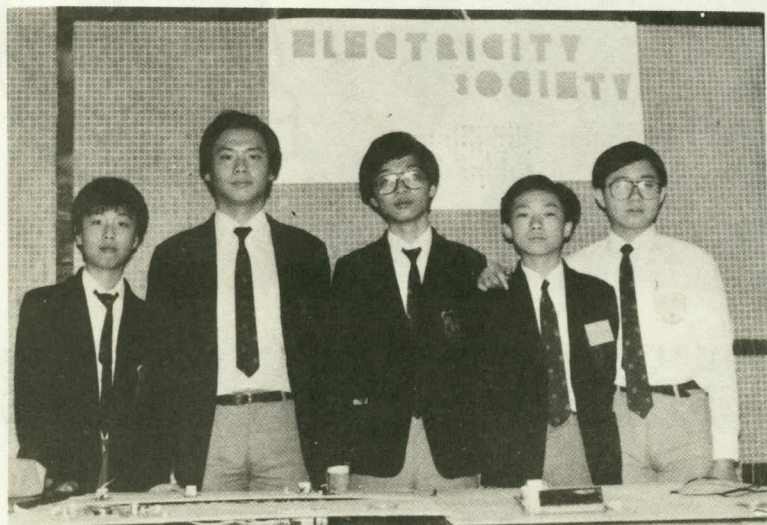


# BASKETBALL CLUB

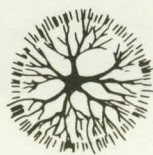

# 會 羽 毛 球

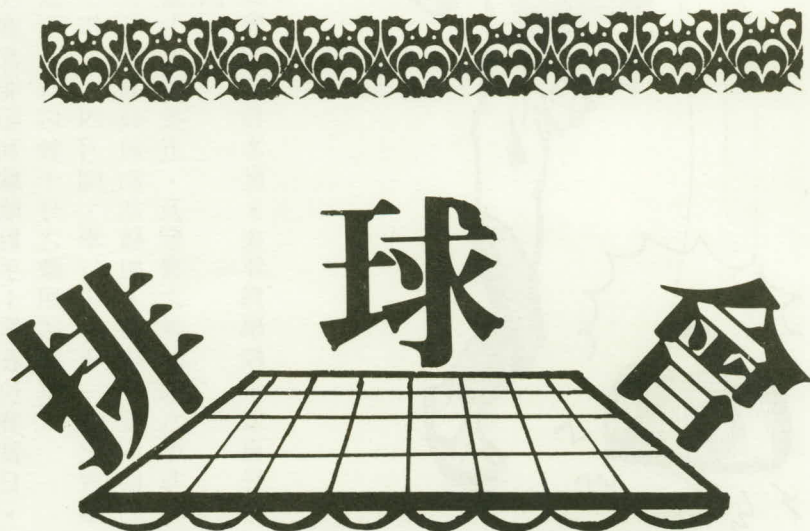

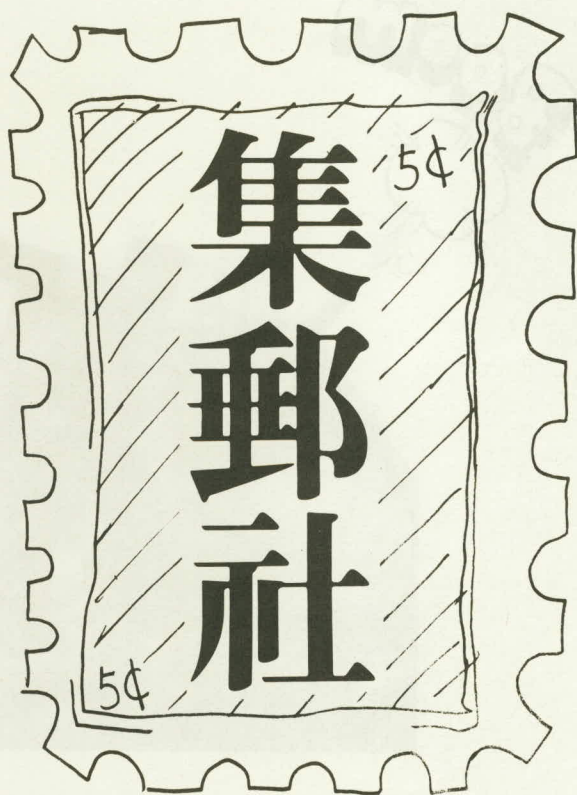


# 會術國

② 集郵常識問答比賽。

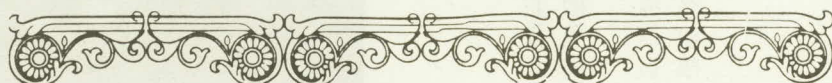
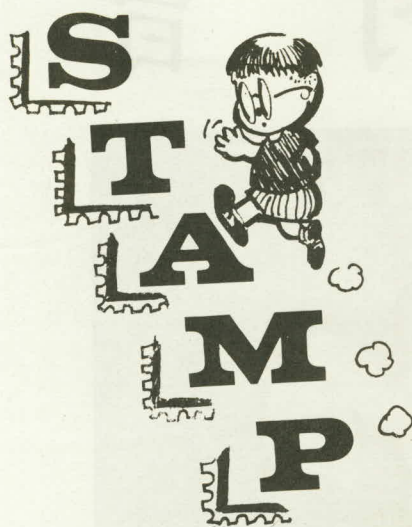

Ever since the inception of the overall championship for HK schools four years ago, this is the first time that St. Louis has taken it. In the previous three years, we played second fiddle to Wah Yan College. We felt that we had our best chance this year, with each of the grades capable of taking their respective championships. Things didn't quite turn out the way that we hoped they would, but each team did come away with a prize.

The development of basketball in St. Louis has almost always been an uphill battle. Tradition has it that St. Louis boys are excellent football and table-tennis players (table-tennis takes a back seat to football, though). This, however, is understandable as any young boy has a tendency to kick things, whether it be a ball, tin, stone or anything that can be made to roll. Coupled with the fact that we have always had a fairly good-sized football pitch and the present ruling that the primary school boys are not permitted to enter the basketball pitch during their recess for fear of disturbing the secondary classes, football cannot help but become more popular.

But, once it got off the ground, interest in basketball among the secondary students has been kept at a fairly high level. So, though football still holds the greatest number of followers, basketball has been able to hold its own. With a little bit of scouting around, boys who show potential are developed into good players.

What, then, makes a good player? Talent, dedication and fighting spirit ---- though these are the pre-requisites of any good sportsman. If you possess height, this will be an advantage, but there are players with height and talent and yet are only mediocre. They often lack the proper mentality to the game. It often happens that players who lack the height have good control, speed and intelligence, and those who have the height are slow, awkward and dull of mind. So, the simplest forms of play take weeks and months before they sink in. But, combine speed, control and intelligence with height, and you have a deadly player who can cut the opposition to pieces.

However, what a player lacks in one area, he can make up for in others. The best antidotes to any ills that a player may have are dedication, fighting spirit and hard work. Any player who is completely lacking in these qualities automatically does not rank very high in a coach's esteem. Selfish players, too, are not often of much use as they often destroy a team's cohesion.



Then, there is the player who thinks he knows better and feels that he can't do wrong. That type of player will never be a team player because he plays for himself. You can spot him very easily on the basketball court. He will shoot when he is too far out and blocked; he will make a desperate drive towards the basket even when there is no opening; and he will keep his head down when he has the ball in possession with only the desire to make a basket for his own personal glory. The good player will make a shot when he has an opening and when his team-mates are in position to make the rebound; the good player will make a drive to draw out the opposition defence so that he can make a pass to a team-mate who can get into position to shoot; and, the good player will constantly move the ball around while keeping an eye out for a team-mate in a good attacking or shooting position. Not every player has these qualities. In fact, there are few who naturally have them, but, these can be learnt. If a player can learn to do these things he will be a better person all round.

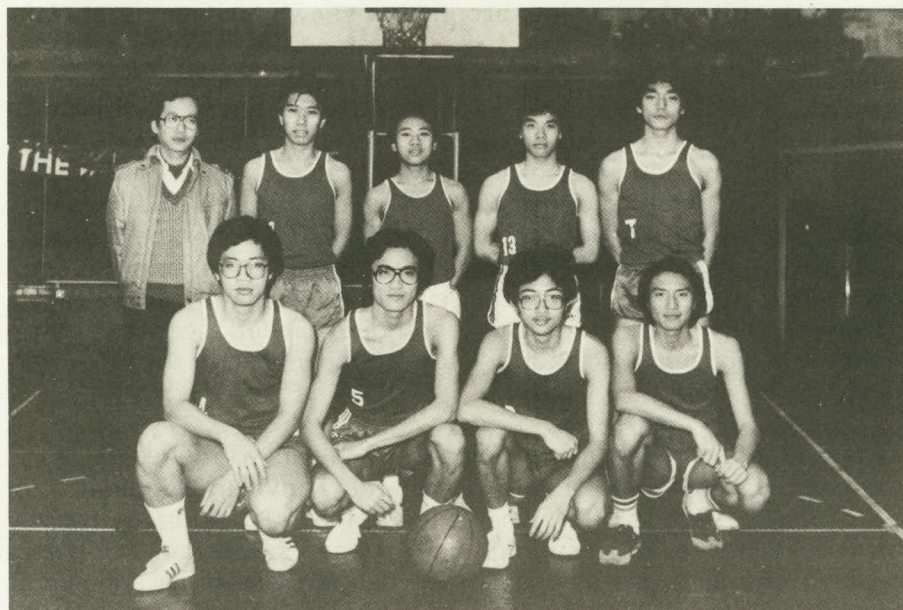
So, we look for and work to produce players of this calibre. Very often, two teams have players of similar individual skills and yet, one team is better than the other. The difference lies in the qualities that have been described. So, if you hope to play for your school, do you have these qualities? If you do, fine. But, if you don't, you can learn, that is if you are willing to learn. The age-old fear that playing for the school and training will interfere with one's studies and results is a complete fallacy. Numerous players who have gone on to university and moved into successful careers have proved this concept completely wrong. It is only the player who doesn't know when to play and when to work that falters and fails.

My family had never kept animals or pets. But not long ago, we started to keep some white mice. Our mice are not those in the drains. We keep these animals because my sister has to do some practices on dissection for coming examination. We put the animals in cages, fed them on vegetables and bread. It is not a good job to keep mice, as their wastes emit awful smell, and it is uneasy to keep them clean and neat. In fear of diseases, we have to give them baths each day, and the cages have to be cleansed all the time. In spite of all these annoying work, we find much pleasure in looking at these little interesting animals.

Mice are not dirty animals, despite the impression in most people's minds being that they are extremely dirty, full of parasites, and carrying epidemics from drains to drains, houses to houses. Their dirty behaviours, which is seen by us, does not originally come from their natural characters, but from human's lack of care on hygiene. The drains and pipes which enable them to hide are the beds of epidemics. We selfishly lay all the accusations on these little creatures. As I observe, mice love neatness in fact. Each time after they have taken bath and are wet from heads to paws, whiskers to tails, they use their small and particularly small hands, or forelimbs to clean their faces, noses. It is funny to look at their silly manner, so innocent, so vivid, so lovely, which would make people laugh. When they clean their faces and bodies, they seem to do it seriously, as if this was a ritual that had to be done every day.

They are optimists. In spite of their being trapped in cages, they seem to consider the cages to be their homes. Although limbs are short, they are agile. They like crawling and climbing about in their cages. Sometimes they climb up, stick out their nostrils, quivering and sniffing as if they have found some unknown aroma. They are used to do this strange action when they notice my approaching.

They seem to have a bad sight. Whenever I put a small piece of food near the cage, they often notice it at once, but make for the wrong direction. Every time, I have to put it exactly into their mouth before they can take the food themselves. Their eating manner is even stranger: they use both of their hands to grasp the food, and eat hesitatingly. Once found that I am putting more food in, they would greedily drop their food in hand and take the new one. They never seem to be satisfied. No matter how much food you give them they can eat all of them instantly.

You scarcely find them sleeping. But their appearance is ridiculous when sleeping. They pack their noses together and their whiskers touch each other. Their faces with eyes close are especially lovely. Their congenial white hair gives us a genial impression.



They are curious. If they are human, they must be inquisitive women. Their curiosity move them not only to sniff everything, but also to bite everything as well: papers, plastics and even the steel of the cage. I usually find scripes of papers around the cage, and the plastic container with a few holes in it every morning.

Seeing how happily they live, I sometimes feel regret for their unfortunate destination.

Sometimes I even think that we human-beings have betrayed them. We feed them, for we are going to kill them, tear off their soft white skin and their flesh. We would spread out all their organs, taking them out, leaving a hollow body. Their flesh and bones, unlike those of cattle, pigs, sheep, which would be made into delicious food and other useful merchandise, are finally thrown into rubbish bins, burnt away. They are not complimented by people, as cattle and pigs are being done so, for what they offer. Their impression in people's hearts is always a thief who steals food, a criminal who disperses diseases, a cursable figure. But these poor white mice have never even conspired to do such things.

They lives are in cages, like those of murderers and serious criminals, although they have never committed a crime yet. When they are finally taken out of their cages, they would never be put back again. We really deprive them of all their things!

Must men necessarily kill these innocent animals in order to achieve scientific progress? Thousands of their compatriots are being maltreated in many parts of the world. They are forced to take drugs, dissected by students, or given numerous kinds of inhuman treatment. In testing a new medicine, thousands of mice are collected and given drugs to see the side-effect. Only few can survive. From the scientific point of view, there is no other way that is so convenient, cheap, and efficient as compared with the making use of mice to do such experiments. Hence killing some of them seems inevitable. But I am afraid no scientists have the right to condemn the poor mice to death! An animal is not for its flesh, not for its blood, but for that they live on earth. If the value of existence is ignored, it is worthless to discuss any more. If we human do not appreciate lives and not consider it as divine, what a pity of man to claim as being supreme on earth!

Sometimes I imagine how the mice will be killed: A mouse is put into a completely sealed box. All that can be found inside are darkness and terror. Then someone opens the lid gently, pours down some chloroform, and closes it again instantly. It feels choking because of the acrid smell. It starts wriggling crazily. It is terified and filled with despair. It struggles and gives out agonized shrieks. Soon it faints and loses consciousness. It is then taken out and placed on the hard, cold surface of a table. A lamp is switched on. Then it is crucified: his four pawns are nailed. With a pair of scissors, his skin is torn apart, from throat to tail, and is spread out, nailed. Its flesh is also removed bit by bit. The whole story ends in death.

How come these mice have to receive such cruel punishment?  
Are they bound to give their lives as sacrifice for science ?

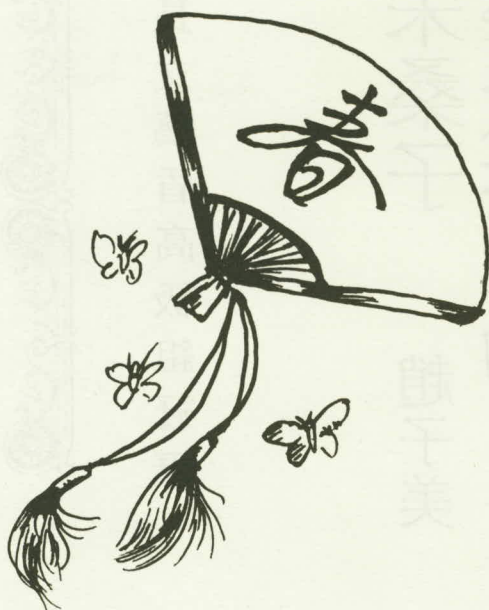

# 小學部校務報告

八一——八二

現在，我們將去年的校務概況，分爲組織、學術、體育、宗教四個部份來簡述。

甲、組織方面：

本校學制：小學部分爲上、下午班，各有小一至小六各級，施行完整的小學教育。計有廿八班，教職員卅八人，學生共有一千三百六十六人。

乙、學術活動方面：

一、參加由教育署舉辦之學能測驗、標準學科測驗等，成績亦相當理想。至於中學派位的成績，在張神父、各位老師、家長及同學的努力合作下，更見卓越，派回本校的學生，佔中學部中一學位約百分之九十（二百中一學位，教署派回本校一百七十八人）。而派至其他學校之情況，亦相當令人滿意。

二、學年中，各老師在張神父領導下，舉行教務及分科會議；檢討各科之教學方法、課程進度、學生之成績和操行之教導，與各項活動之計劃。第二、三次考試期間，學校亦曾舉行分科會議，各次會議的記錄亦分發給各位老師，用以執行和參考之用。開學前之校務會議，亦曾檢查前學期的記錄而有所改進。

三、本校每學期各舉行考試兩次，平時有定期之測驗，故一般學生之成績表現均堪稱滿意。而且，在每次考試後，均約見家長商討對策，以改善和輔導在學業或操行上未如理想之學生。

四、鼓勵教師參加教育署舉辦之學術性研討會及訓練班。鼓勵及安排學生接受牙齒保健和防疫注射。響應防癆募捐及協助推銷天主教福利會之慈善獎券等。

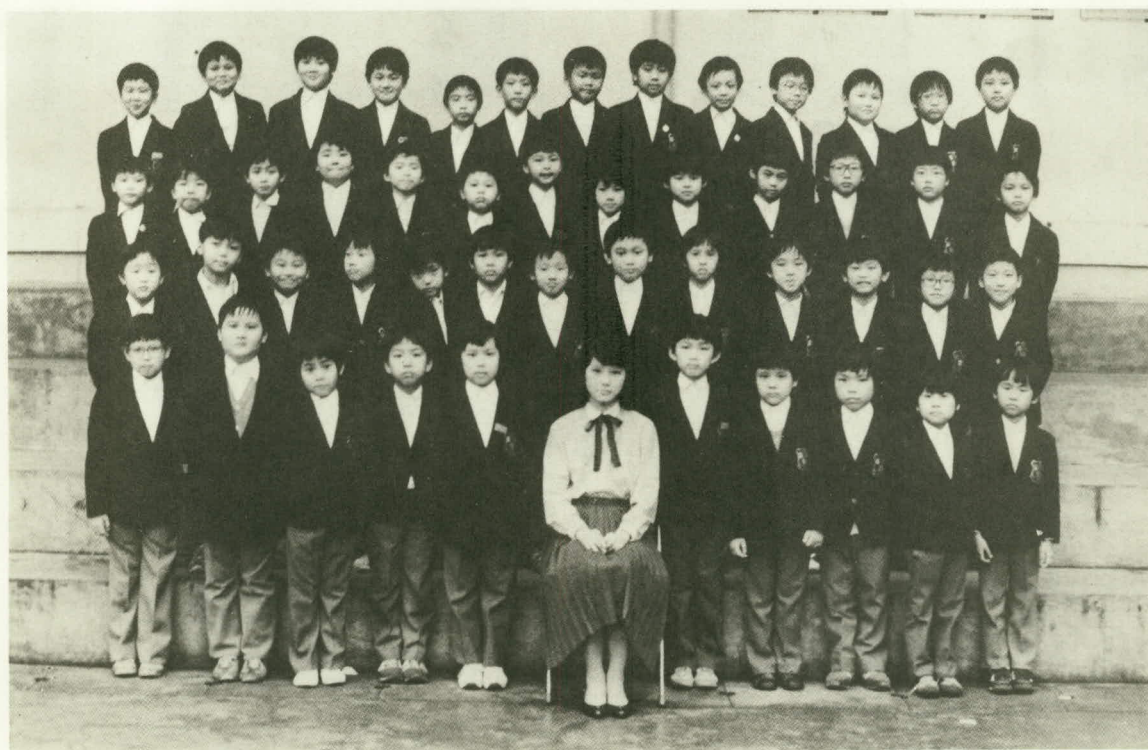


P.3B Miss Chu Yuen Si



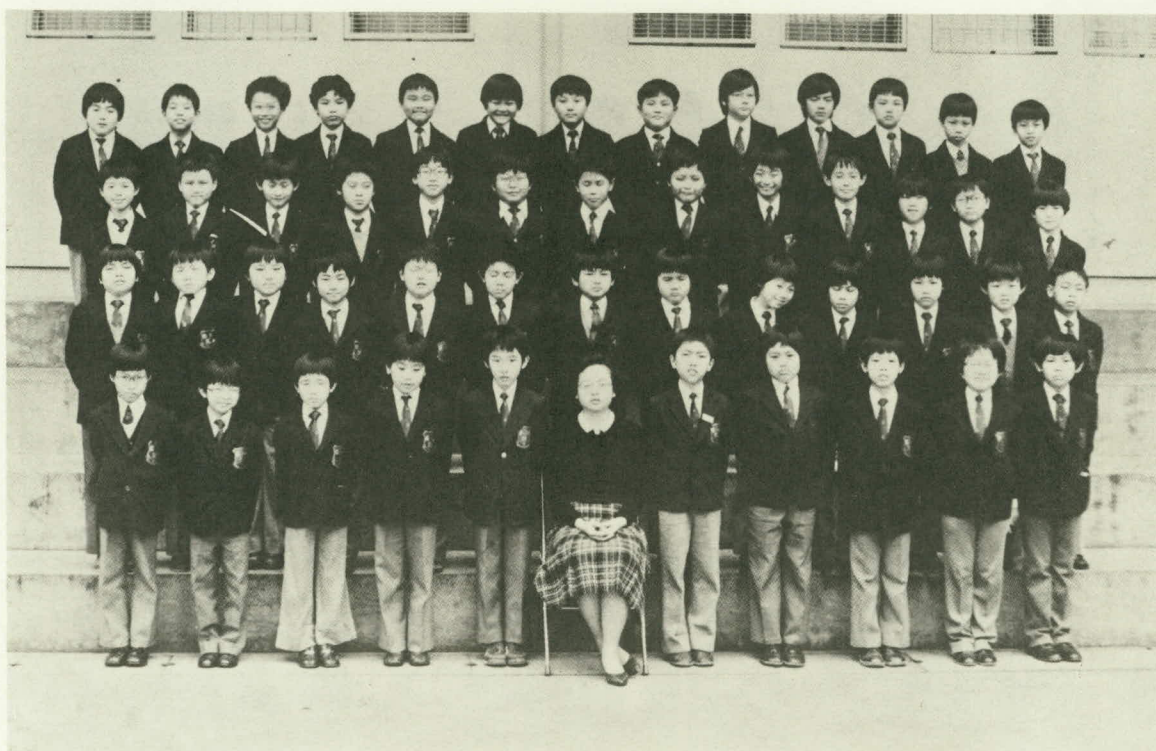


P.3D Miss Fung Lai Ching

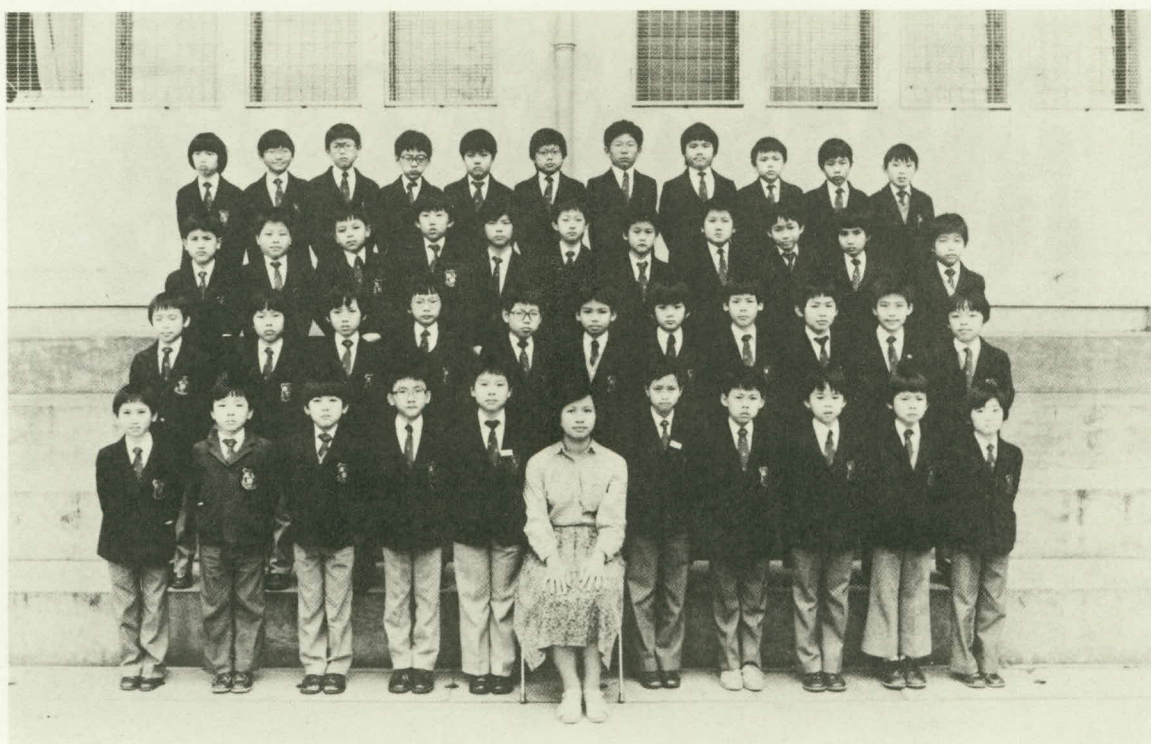

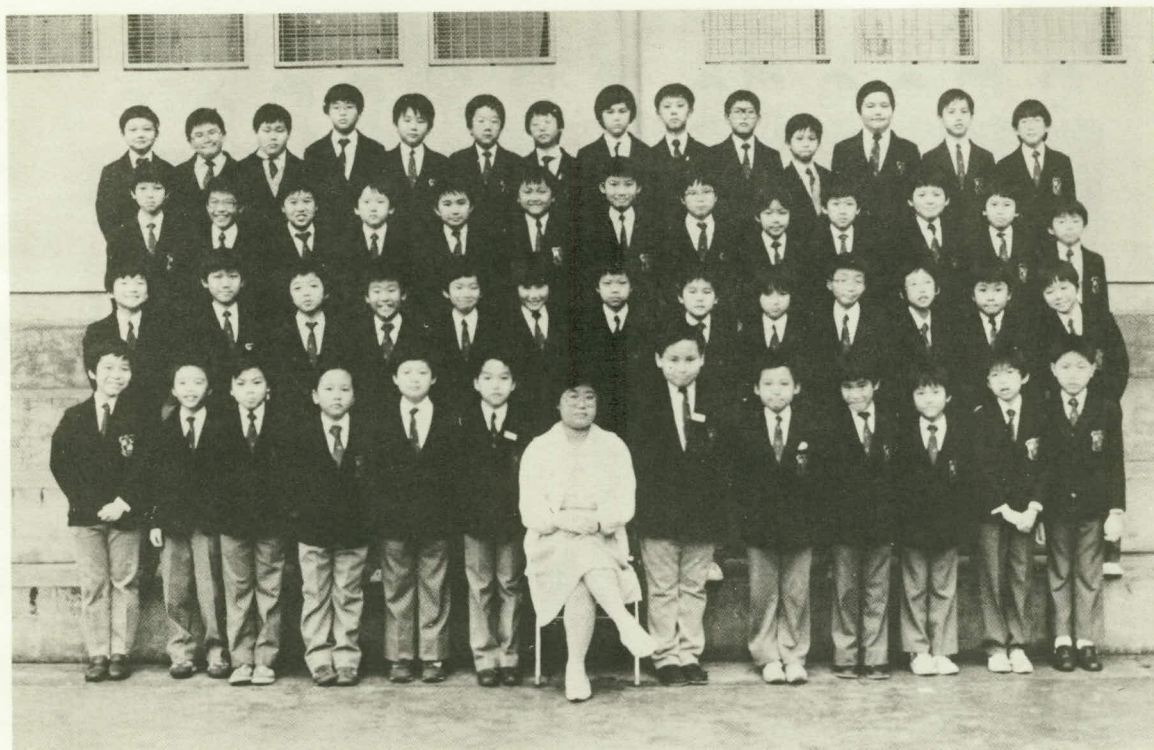


P.4A Miss Chan Kwai Wah

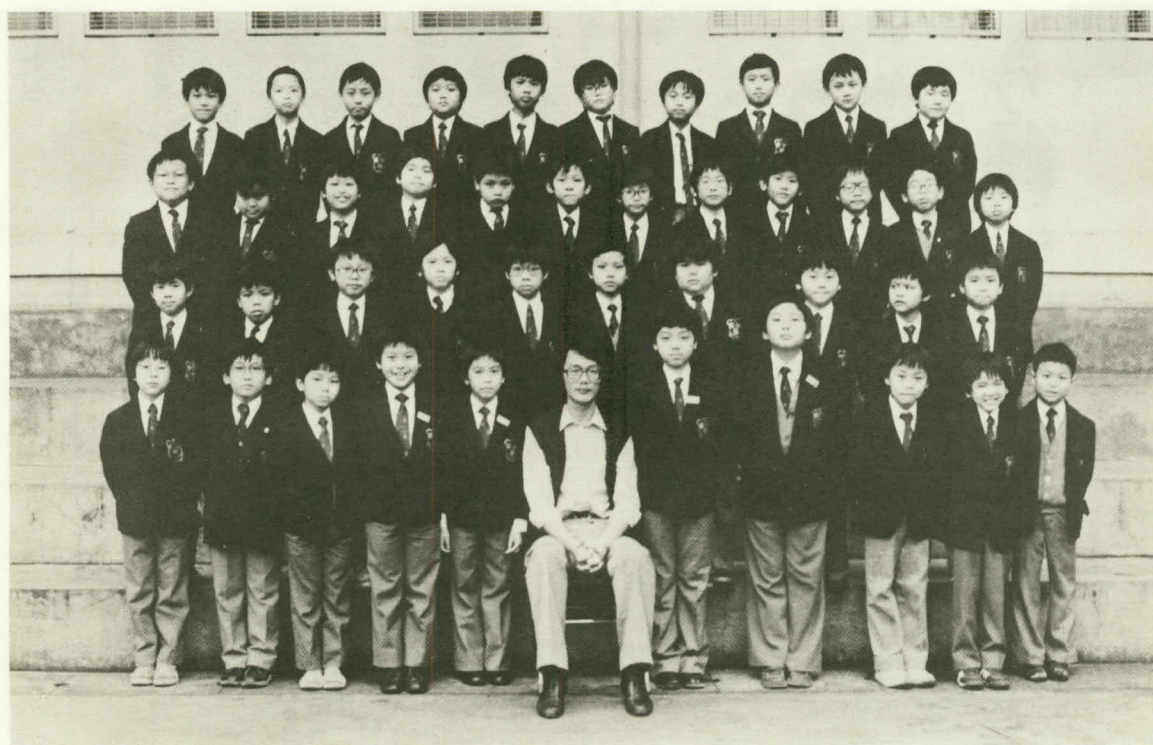

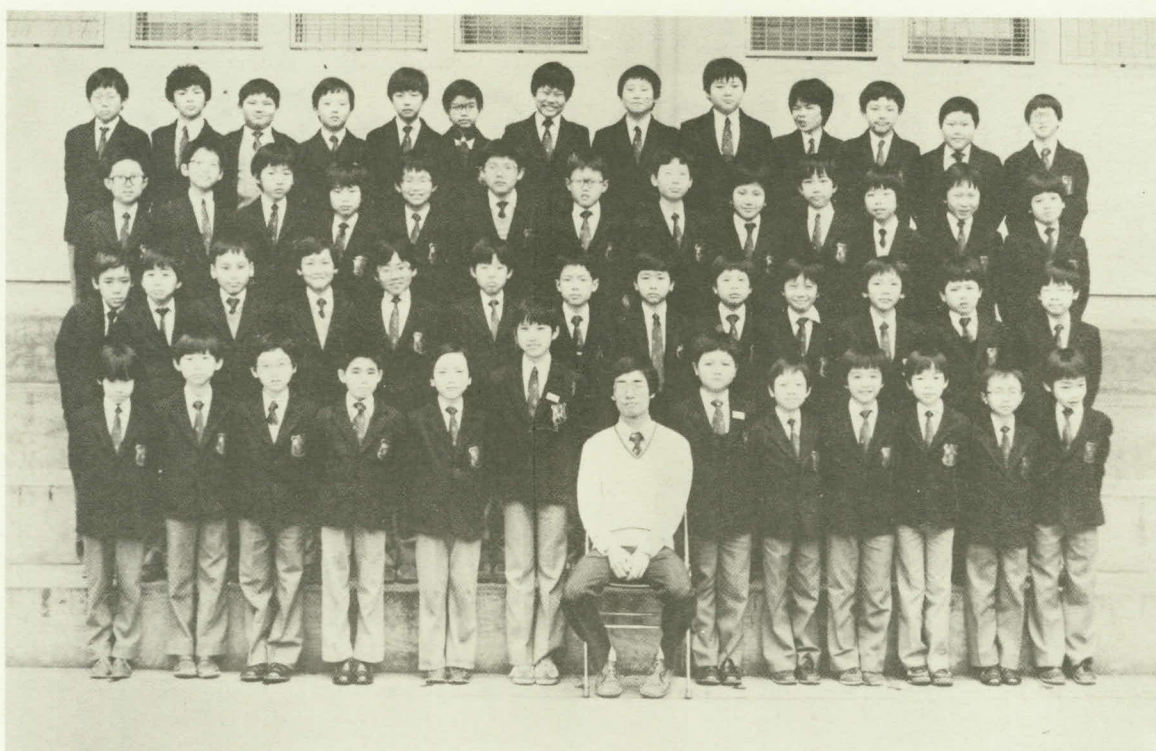


P.4D Miss Choy Man Yue

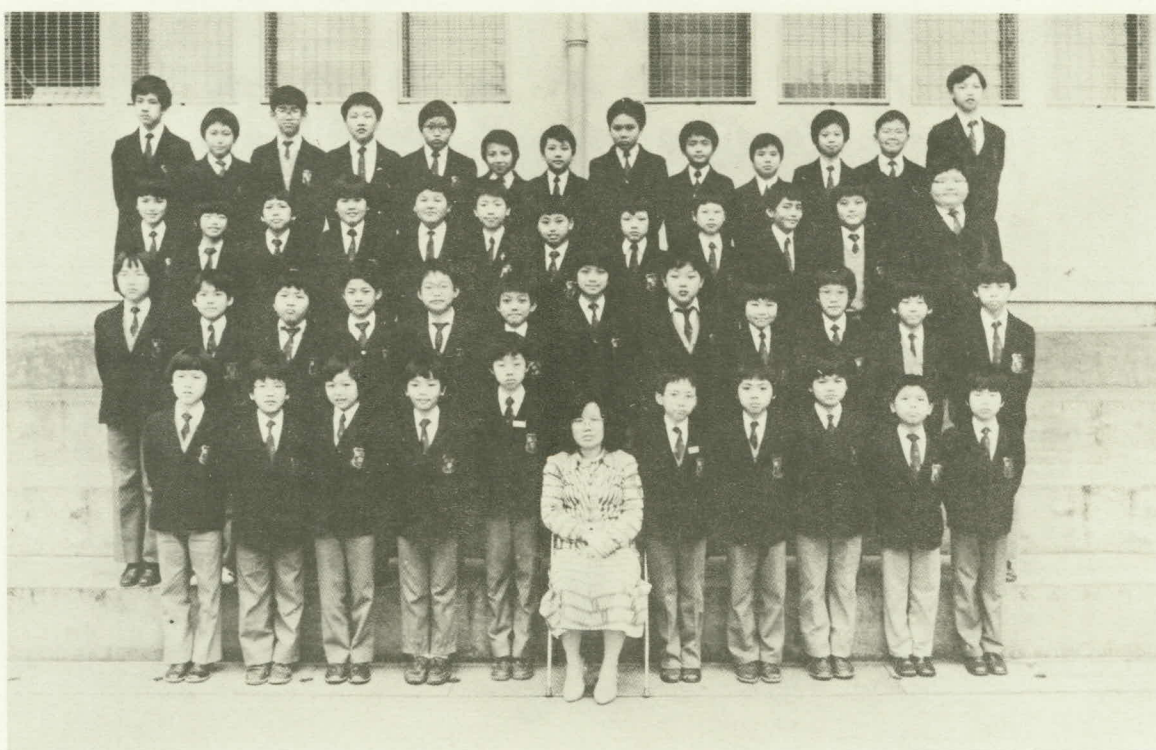
